

Explanation eBook Formats and How They Work

Epub File Format (Format provided for iPhone, iPad, Nook, Kobo and other devices)

An EPUB file (short for electronic publication) is a free and open e-book standard by the International Digital Publishing Forum (IDPF). Files have the extension .epub.

Most dedicated e-book readers support the EPUB format (except for the Amazon Kindle line of devices). EPUB reading software is also available for smartphones. Devices that support EPUB include Android devices (using Aldiko, CoolReader, FBReader etc), Barnes & Noble Nook, BlackBerry PlayBook, iPad, iPhone, and iPod Touch (using iBooks), Kobo eReader, Sony Reader and Windows Phone (using Freda or Stanzetta or other similar apps).

Mobi File Format (Format provided for Kindle devices)

A mobi file is a Mobipocket eBook file developed by a French company called Mobipocket which was bought by Amazon in 2005. Mobi books can be read on the Amazon Kindle natively, as well as in Amazon Kindle programs on other devices.

To add a mobi file to your Kindle, connect your Kindle to your computer using a USB cable and drag and drop the “.mobi” Ebook file into the documents folder on your Kindle (or into either the “Books” or “Documents” folder on your Kindle Fire). Your books will then show up in your Kindle library or in the Docs section of your Kindle Fire, as well as in the carousel.
